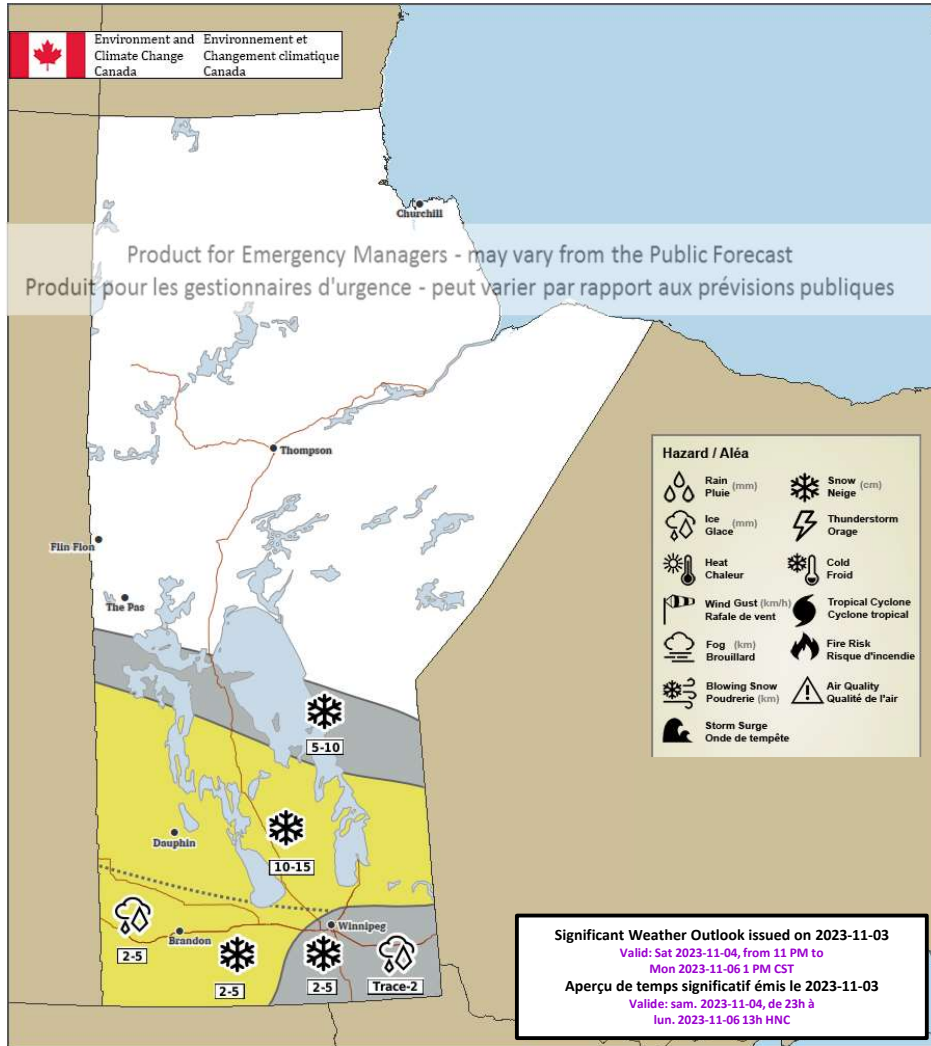




Snow and Freezing Rain for Southern Manitoba

Impacts

- Heavy wet snow may accumulate on infrastructure and make travel hazardous.
- Reduced visibility in snow.
- Surfaces such as highways, roads, walkways and parking lots will become difficult to navigate due to freezing rain in southwestern Manitoba.



Certainty

- **Snowfall:**
 - **Moderate** confidence in areas with the heaviest snowfall amounts
 - **Low to Moderate** confidence in total snowfall amounts
 - Precipitation along and south of the Trans-Canada will likely start as rain
 - Southern regions will experience wet snow so amounts will vary locally
- **Freezing rain:**
 - **Moderate** confidence in areas with freezing rain
 - **Low to Moderate** confidence in freezing rain accumulation

Key Points

- In the overnight hours of Saturday, November 4, heavy snow will spread into central and southern Manitoba with patchy freezing rain over the southwest.
- Rain or freezing rain possible along and south of the Trans-Canada.
 - Most likely on Sunday between the early morning and afternoon hours.
 - 2-5 mm of ice accumulation is possible in the southern yellow area, which includes **Brandon**.
 - The southern grey area, including **Winnipeg** may receive trace to 2mm of ice accumulation
- Precipitation spreads west to east during the day on Sunday. Higher confidence in snow totals north of the Trans-Canada
 - The northern yellow area, which includes **Dauphin** and the southern **Interlakes** region, is expected to receive 10-15 cm with locally 20cm.
- Areas south of the Trans Canada are expected to receive rain-snow mix, wet snow and some freezing rain, which will limit total snowfall accumulations.
 - 2-5 cm of total snowfall is possible in southern areas including **Brandon, Portage la Prairie, and Winnipeg**.
- Heavy snow will persist in the Interlakes and southeast region Sunday evening and overnight.
- Scattered flurries will continue Monday morning before easing later in the day.
